## 10th District Rated Banner Republican Congressional District

The Tenth District is the banner Republican congressional district in the United States. Congressman-Elect George A. Paddock's margin of 73,591 votes on November 5 will be the highest Republican district plurality in the 77th Congress, it was announced early this week. This is the second largest majority in 10th District records, and the largest since former Congressman Carl R. Chindblom won with 95,909 votes in 1924.

Mr. Paddock, final figures show, received 199,418 votes to 125,827 for his Democratic opponent. Of this, 161,084 were in Cook county and 38,334 in Lake county; the Democratic vote was 104,910 in Cook and 20,917 in Lake county.

The congressman-elect recently returned from Washington, where he conferred with Republican leaders and future colleagues. Mr. Paddock announced that his office staff would include Miss Sigrid Hjorth of Chicago, who was secretary to former Congressman Chindblom, and Mrs. Elsie Coleman, secretary of the late James W. Good while he was congressman from Iowa and until he became a member of President Coolidge's cabinet. Mrs. Coleman is at present secretary to Congressman Charles Hawks, Jr. (R) of Wisconsin, who was defeated for reelection November 5.
