All Thirsty Residents

Before Illinois had shown the nation that it had resources sufficient to attract millions of residents, an observer in a letter to a periodical publication expressed doubt that enough water could be found in the central part of the state to meet the needs of great cities.

However, says the Illinois Writers Projects, W.P.A., he admitted that his opinion had changed after observing the successful operation of coal mines. "Below, at a distance of 50 and 100 feet," he wrote, "the supply of water is such that scarcely one coal shaft in 10 sunk on the prairies can be brought to

advantage. I hope one of these days to see a coal mine in operation whose products will light the furnaces of a whole country, while its surplus water will furnish a city of 10,000 inhabitants."

Today Illinois has over 50 cities, each of which has a population of more than 10,000.
