

## LAKE CO. NATIONAL GUARD TO BE FETED

"Going Away Party" Planned at Waukegan Armory December 14.

A going-away party for the Lake County National Guard and Selec-

tees will be held at the Armory in Waukegan on Saturday evening, December 14th, beginning at 8 o'clock. It promises to be the gala event of the season with entertainment, cards, military exhibition and dancing. Music for dancing will be furnished by "Red" Edwards' popular 11-piece dance orchestra.

The purpose of the party is to provide a regimental welfare fund

for members of the regiment and for the selectees from Lake county who will later join the regiment. Lt. Col. Joseph A. Teece is the executive officer in charge of the local units of the 129th Infantry U.S.A. and expects to leave with his regiment to a camp in Tennessee about the middle of January.

Mayor Talcott, Mayor of Waukegan is acting as general chairman of the committee sponsoring this affair and has enlisted the active support of nearly every mayor and village president in Lake county. The 14 American Legion posts in the county are backing the party 100% and are co-operating with the committee on the advance distribution and sale of tickets. Captain Bradford F. West of Waukegan, who is chairman of the Committee on Military Contacts of the National Defense committee of the Waukegan Chamber of Commerce, is acting as executive chairman of the committee in charge. He states that a splendid and sparkling program is assured with plenty of entertainment, fun and dancing.

Tickets priced at 50c per person are now in the hands of the officers

of every city and village in the county. Vernon Rosenthal who is in charge of the distribution and sale of tickets reports that the commanders of the 14 Legion posts are co-operating in the advance ticket sale under the leadership of Douglas Getchell of Grayslake. Tickets may also be purchased from the officers and enlisted men in the National Guard. A minimum of 3,000 tickets sold is the goal set by the General committee and every dollar received from the sale of tickets will be turned over to the First National Bank of Waukegan, as trustee of the Welfare fund, clear of any promotional expense. Dress will be military uniforms, formal or informal.

Mrs. George S. McGaughey, president of the Auxiliary of the Homer Dahringer post American Legion and Mrs. Noel White of Fox Lake are in charge of the card party for the early part of the evening. Other special features of the program of entertainment have been arranged for by the committee headed by Andy Dicello of North Chicago, who promise plenty of fine musical numbers, tap-dancing and stage performances.

A large number of distinguished guests, prominent in State and Military affairs, have been invited. The mayors, village presidents and American Legion commanders of the county will serve with Lt. Col. Teece as a reception committee. Everyone is urged to unite to make this affair a tremendous success and to pay a fitting tribute and recognition to our National Guardsmen and selectees.

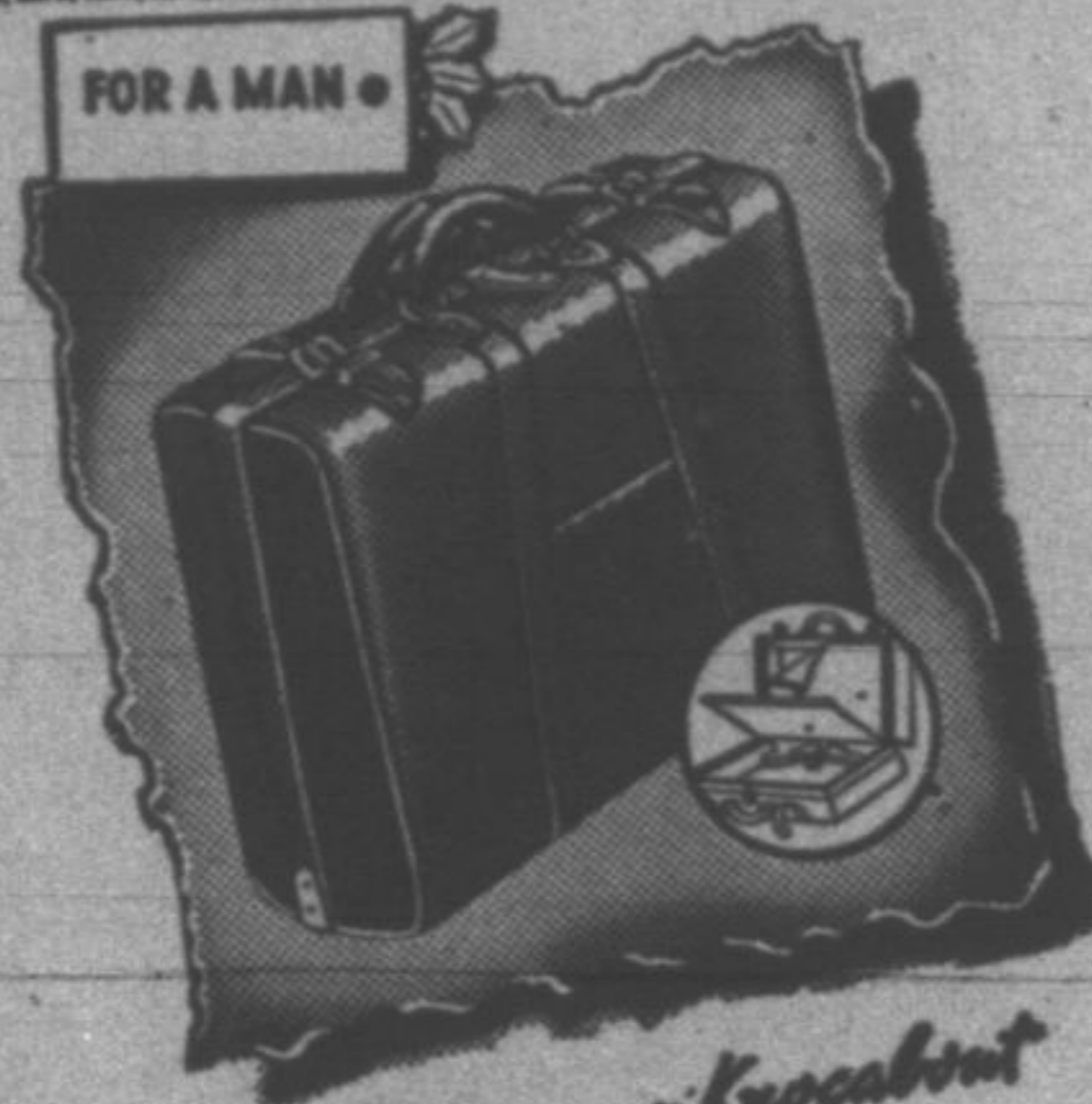
