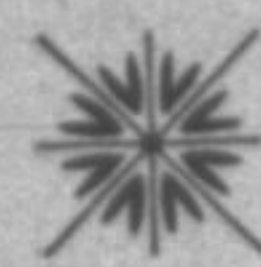

CHRISTIAN SCIENCE CHURCHES

"God the Only Cause and Cre-
ator" was the subject of the Lesson-
Sermon in all Churches of Christ,
Scientist, on Sunday, December 8.

The Golden Text was, "Every
house is builded by some man; but
he that built all things is God"
(Hebrews 3:4).

Among the citations which com-
prised the Lesson-Sermon was the
following from the Bible: "Many,
O Lord my God, are thy wonderful
works which thou hast done, and
thy thoughts which are to us-ward:
they cannot be reckoned up in order
unto thee: if I would declare and
speak of them, they are more than
can be numbered" (Psalms 40:5).

The Lesson-Sermon also in-
cluded the following passages from
the Christian Science textbook,
"Science and Health with Key to the
Scriptures," by Mary Baker Eddy:
"There is but one creator and one
creation. This creation consists of
the unfolding of spiritual ideas and
their identities, which are embraced
in the infinite Mind and forever re-
flected. These ideas range from the
infinitesimal to infinity, and the
highest ideas are the sons and
daughters of God" (p. 502).
