John A. Bunnel Dies; Funeral Held Tuesday

John A. Bunnell, 75 died Monday at his home, 249 Maple Ave., following a long illness. He had been a resident of Highland Park for about 30 years and was a member of Trinity Episcopal church of which he served as vestryman for many years. He was also a member of Exmoor club.
