Stuffing News

A bird on the table is worth two on the wing-especially when it has come out of the oven browned to a turn, crackling and fragrant with the inviting promise of tender, wellseasoned stuffing within. Stuffing does its part not only by adding flavor but also by absorbing juices and keeping the fowl moist and shapely during roasting.

Bread for stuffing is best when a day or two old, and broken or cut into small pieces. For a special two ways. By going "back home" flavor, toast the cubes lightly. Only for a visit, or by bringing the home stuffing, for those who like stuffing with gravy, may be baked in a as possible.

BREAD STUFFING (For Chicken)

teaspoon poultry seasoning

tablespoons melted butter or chicken fat teaspoons salt

slightly beaten egg teaspoon minced onion 1/3 cup boiling water

Mix ingredients together lightly, blending thoroughly. For a dry, crumbly dressing, water may be omitted. For a moist dressing add 2 teaspoons baking powder to prevent sogginess.


