In the Marine dining room he will splotlight his unique "Parade of Bands" novelty, donning caricature masks while he directs his band in the style of such popular leaders as Wayne King, Rudy Vallee, Guy Lombardo and Benny Goodman.

In addition to his own radio success, which won him Radio Guide Magazine's "Most Poular Leader" poll in 1938, Himber has discovered many successful dance leaders. His first "Big-Time" dance band in-

cluded such budding stars as Benny Goodman, Artie Shaw, Tommy Dorsey, and Bunny Berrigan.

Another potential Himber discovery, the maestro wires from the Loew's State Theater in New York, is Dick Judge, his handsome new vocalist, who will join the Champions for the first time at the Edgewater Beach.
