"Himbers' Radio Champions" Now At Marine Dining Room

Chicagoans will dance for the first time to one of radio's most popular maestros when Richard Himber and his "Studebaker Champions" open at the Edgewater Beach Hotel's world-famed Marine Dining room Saturday, December 21st. Himber will remain at the Beach through the holiday season with a special New Year show featuring the Four Collegians, the "All American Athletes"; Rolly and Verna Pickert, who tap on stilts; Frances Willer, Willetta Dennis, Dolly Arden and the Dorothy Dorben Dancers, and Ruth Vale, vocalist.

Most famous as musical director of the "Champions" radio series for more than five years, Himber is beginning his first nationwide dance tour with a four-week engagement at the Beach.

In the Marine dining room he will spotlight his unique "Parade of Bands" novelty, donning caricature masks while he directs his band in the style of such popular leaders as Wayne King, Rudy Vallee, Guy Lombardo and Benny Goodman.

In addition to his own radio success, which won him Radio Guide Magazine's "Most Popular Leader" poll in 1938, Himber has discovered many successful dance leaders. His first "Big-Time" dance band in-

cluded such budding stars as Benny Goodman, Artie Shaw, Tommy Dorsey, and Bunny Berrigan.

Another potential Himber discovery, the maestro wires from the Loew's State Theater in New York, is Dick Judge, his handsome new vocalist, who will join the Champions for the first time at the Edgewater Beach.

Himber's Marine dining room engagement marks a new page in his broadcasting. For the first time since his radio debut the conductor will broadcast without his famous theme song. "It Isn't Fair," banned by the controversy between songwriters and broadcasters. In its place he will use a new theme, "Falling in Love," which he has just recorded, along with a new edition of his "Parade of Bands."

"It Isn't Fair" was written by Victor Young an alumnus of the Edgewater Beach Hotel's Oriole Terrace Orchestra of the twenties. Young wrote the song as theme for the first Studebaker Champions broadcast nearly 11 years ago.
