Youths between the ages of 17 and 23½ years of age are eligible for selection if they are physically fit, of good character, not in regular school attendance and in need of employment.

Under the new regulations \$7,000 of the enrollee's \$30 monthly earnings will be set aside in a special fund, so that at the end of the six months period he will be given \$42 to buy clothing and other necessities while looking for work. He will receive \$8 monthly for his own use and \$15 is sent to his dependents.

### Former Resident Gets Refund On Inheritance Tax

John H. DeMuth, former Highland Park resident must now appear before the state treasurer at Springfield to get a refund of \$2,070.74 in inheritance taxes that was paid on Sept. 6, 1934, it was revealed last week by Assistant Attorney General Philip W. Yager when he put his initials on a court order signed by Judge Perry L. Persons authorizing the refund.

In the distribution of the estate of his father, the late Benjamin F. DeMuth, in 1934, John was to receive an inheritance of \$21,009.19 when he reached his 50th birthday. DeMuth was at that time 44 years old. DeMuth at that time was allowed an exemption of \$100, instead of the \$20,000 exemption for immediate members of the family and he was assessed on \$20,909.19 instead of \$1,009.19.

DeMuth recently reached his 50th birthday and his counsel, Attorney Edmund S. Cummings of Chicago appeared in county court today with a petition showing that DeMuth was alive on his birthday and asking for the refund. Judge Persons signed the court order authorizing the refund and now DeMuth must call on the state treasurer to obtain the "overpayment."

Msgr. Francis J. Wagner, pastor of St. Mary's church in Evanston and former pastor of St. James church in Highwood, has been named by Pope Pius XII as bishop of Marquette, Michigan. The announcement was made in Washington last week by Archbishop Amleto Giovanni Cicognani, apostolic delegate to the United States.

Bishop Wagner will be consecrated in Holy Name, Cathedral Chicago, by Archbishop Samuel A. Stritch, the date of which has not yet been announced, after which he will go to St. Peter's cathedral in Marquette.
