CHRISTIAN SCIENCE CHURCHES

"Christian Science" was the subject of the Lesson-Sermon in all Churches of Christ, Scientist, on Sunday, December 29.

The Golden Text was, "The kingdom of heaven is like unto leaven, which a woman took, and hid in three measures of meal, till the whole was leavened" (Matthew 13:33).

Among the citations which comprised the Lesson-Sermon was the following from the Bible: "Blessed is the man that trusteth in the Lord, and whose hope the Lord is. For he shall be as a tree planted by the waters, and that spreadeth out her roots by the river, and shall not see when heat cometh, but her leaf thall be green; and shall not be Careful in the year of drought, newher shall cease from yielding fruit. Heal me, O Lord, and I shall be heared; save me, and I shall be saved: for thou art my praise" (Jeremiah 17:7, 8, 14).

The Less n-Sermon also included the following passages from the Christian Ecience textbook, "Science and Health with Key to the Scriptures," by Mary Baker Eddy: "Whoever would demonstrate the healing of Christian Science munt abide strictly by its rules, heal every statement, and advance from the rudiments laid down. There is nothing difficult nor toilsome in that task, when the way is pointed out but self-denial, sincerity, Christian ity, and persistence alone win the prize, as they usually do in every department of life" (p. 462).
