### Mischa Levitzki, Noted Pianist, On North Shore Series

Mischa Levitzki, world famed pianist, is scheduled to appear at 8:30 Tuesday night, January 28, in the Highland Park High school auditorium, as the third feature in the current North Shore series.

Though still in his thirties, Mischa Levitzki has been known to American and European audiences for many years, and his name has become synonymous with absolute perfection in piano playing. One of

the few giants of the keyboard, his flawless virtuosity has become a goal for which other artists strive.

Levitzki was born in Russia of naturalized American parents, thereby being an American himself. He began his pianistic studies at the age of seven. Five years later his inherent genius was so apparent that he was taken to Berlin, where he studied under Dohnanyi. His Berlin debut in 1914 was sensational. Only 15 at the time, his technical brilliance caused a tumultuous demonstration.

Following a tour of Central Europe and Scandinavia, he came to America, making his debut in this country on October 17, 1916. Since then he has toured over the entire world — in distant Java, Singapore, China, Japan and Australia, as well as throughout Europe and the United States.
