## To Meet January 23 To Discuss Soldier Recreation Problem

Delegates of member organizations of the Co-ordinating Council of Highland Park have been summoned to a meeting called by Mayor Ronan for Thursday evening, January 23 at 8 p.m. at the Community House. Mayor Ronan will put before the council which represents all organizations in Highland Park the matter of how to deal with the problems of recreation which our city will need to face when 15,000 soldiers are living almost next door to us at Fort Sheridan.

Mayor Ronan and other civic leaders are concerned that Highland Park will be prepared with a plan for meeting the demands made upon our community resource and he will invite the cooperation of the council delegates. It is important that every organization have its delegate or alternate present at this meeting.

## First National Bank Holds Annual Meeting
