Legion Will Hear Edward K. Lewis At Monthly Smoker

Mr. Lewis is a prominent attorney associated with the International Harvester company. He is an authority on current events, a student of American history and political thought and a well known author of several books among which are "America—A Nation or Confusion." He is a graduate of Harvard university and saw extensive active service in France during the last war as an officer in the infantry.

The speaker has chosen as his subject "The Present Crisis," and in view of present events his talk should prove most timely and highly interesting.

Red Cross First Aid Classes For Police and Fire Departments

Entire personnel of the Highland Park Police and Fire Departments is to receive training in Red Cross first aid in classes beginning next week, it has been announced by H. F. Kelley, general chairman of the Highland Park Red Cross.

Two classes have been organized, one meeting Tuesday afternoons from 2 to 4 o'clock beginning January 21, and one Thursday evenings from 7 to 9 o'clock, beginning January 23. Each class will meet for 10 weeks. Police Chief Rex Andrews and Fire Chief Edward C. Hoksins, organized the classes, which will be taught by a staff instructor of the Chicago Chapter, American Red Cross.

Red Cross first aid training instructs individuals in the care of accident victims before the arrival of a physician. Subjects include treatment of victims of fractures, poisons, burns, suffocation and other accidents.
