"Love" was the subject of the Lesson-Sermon in all Churches of Christ, Scientist, on Sunday, February 2.

The Golden Text was, "The Lord hath appeared of old unto me saying, Yea, I have loved thee with an everlasting love: therefore with lovingkindness have I drawn thee'

(Jeremiah 31:3).

Among the citations which comprised the Lesson-Sermon was the following from the Bible: "And when I'aul had gathered a bundle of sticks. and laid them on the fire, there came a viper out of the heat, and fastened on his hand. And when the barbarians saw the venomous beast hang on his hand, they said among themselves, No doubt this man is a murderer, whom, though he hath escaped the sea, yet vengeance suffereth not to live. And he shook off the beast into the fire, and felt no harm" (Acts 28:3-5).

The Lesson-Sermon also included the following passages from the Christian Science textbook "Science and Health with Key to the Scriptures" by Mary Baker Eddy "The divine Love, which made harm less the poisonous viper, which de livered men from the boiling oil. from the flery furnace, from the jaws of the lion, can heal the sick in every age and triumph over sin and death" (p. 243).
