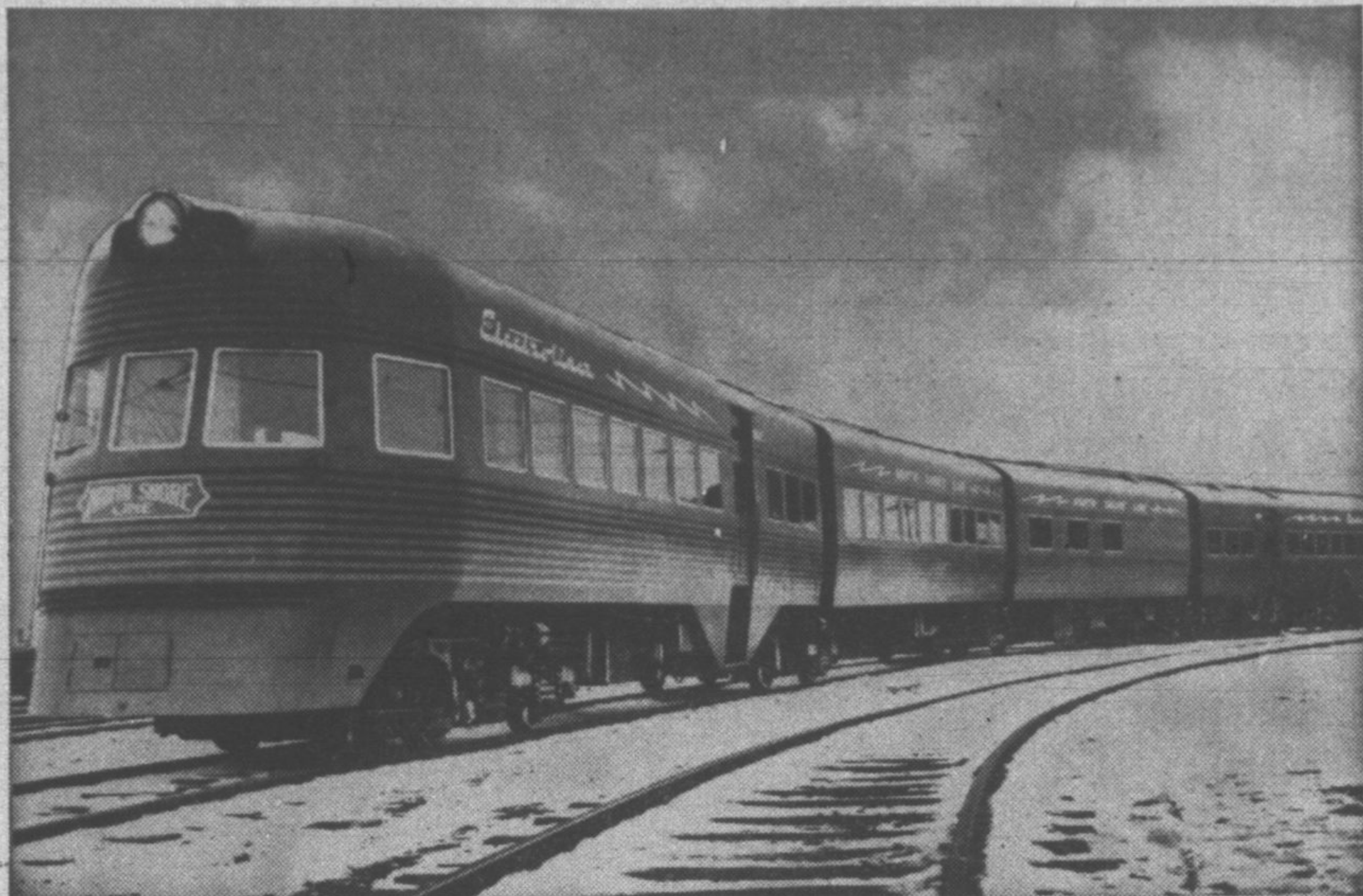


# North Shore Line New Electroliners

## League of Women Voters To Look Into Milk Problems Feb. 19

Milk is continuously in the news of the day. Now it is a farmers' strike, now there are indictments, then the union strikes, then there is an issue about paper containers, and then the Chicago City Council threatens to put inspection costs onto the farmer and there is talk of a price rise. In order to judge fairly the issues in these various questions the League of Women Voters feels that its members should have an understanding of the problems confronting the milk industry.

Therefore, the regular monthly meeting of the Highland Park League being held at the Y.W.C.A. at 1:15 p.m. on Wednesday, Feb. 19, is to be devoted to a panel discussion on the milk problem, with representatives of farmer, dealer, and labor associations as well as the Federal Milk Market Administrator's office telling about their problems and activities. It is also hoped that these men will express their opinions on the Federal Milk Market machinery, on a proposed state milk control law, and on the adequacy of sanitary legislation in areas not affected by city ordinances.—Mrs. G. K. Hardacre, publicity chairman for the league.
