ice carnival where Nancy is a student.

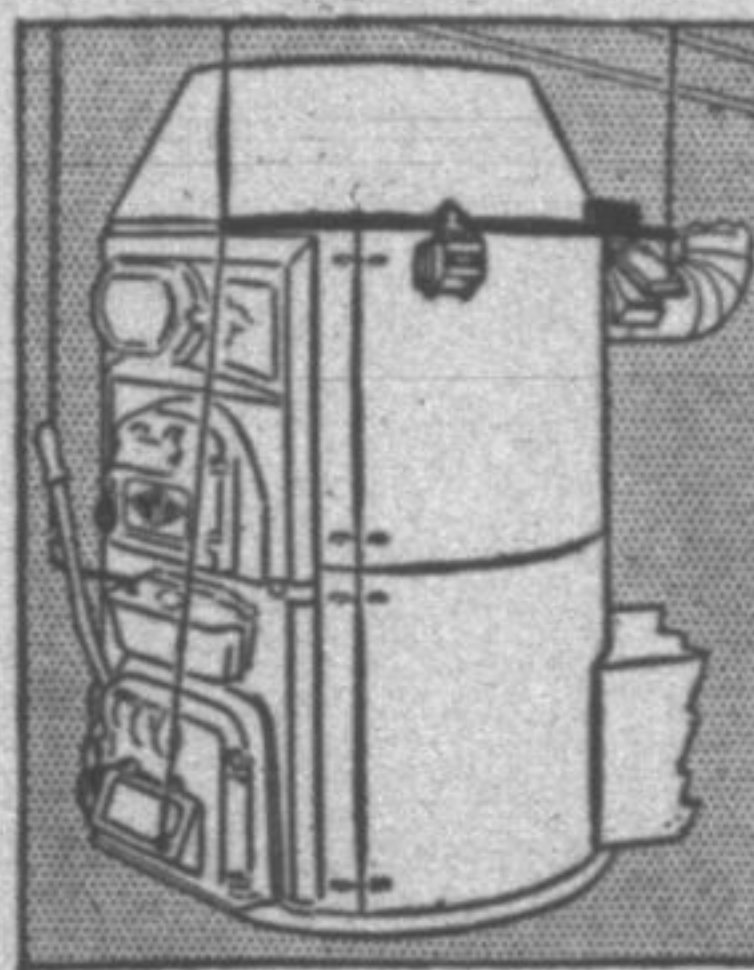
