Lewis, manager of the Board's Waukegan field office, said the representative will be glad to assist employers, employees and others who wish to ask specific questions, or who desire information on the filling out of forms, obtaining account numbers, or establishing claims for old-age and survivors insurance. Highwood Postoffice Needs Clerk-Carrier

The Highwood post office announces a civil service examination to be held for a substitute clerk-carrier for employment in Highwood.

Applications must be on file with the manager of the seventh U. S. civil service district at the Chicago postoffice building not later than Feb. 25. Persons who enter this examination will not be allowed to enter any other examination for which the receipt of applications will close on the above date.

From the eligibles resulting from the examination, certification will be made to fill existing and future vacancies in the positions of substitute clerk and carrier. Substitutes must be available for duty on short notice and at regular intervals, and must be able to operate an automobile.

Age limits are 18 and 48, but for those with military service the latter limit is 65.

Persons living in the area of the Highwood postoffice will be given preference in the eligibility list. Sample questions and additional information may be obtained from any first or second class postoffice.
