Suicide Verdict In Death Of F. Rennhack

Rennhack, who was a guard for the Chicago Rapid Transit company, was found dead in his car at 8:15

Saturday morning by his wife, in a field near his home. A garden hose was attached from the exhaust of the car to the interior. The ignition key was turned on.

A note declaring his intent to end his life was found among his effects. No motive was revealed.

Funeral services were held Tuesday afternoon from the Weimserhirsch chapel in Chicago. Burial was in Memorial Park.
