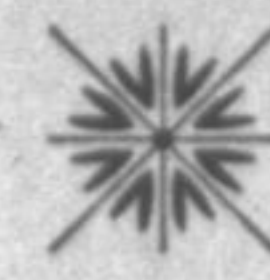

### CHRISTIAN SCIENCE CHURCHES

"Mind" was the subject of the  
Lesson-Sermon in all Churches of  
Christ Scientist, on Sunday, Feb-  
ruary 23.

The Golden Text was, "It is God  
which worketh in you both to will  
and to do of his good pleasure"  
(Philippians 2:13).

Among the citations which com-  
prised the Lesson-Sermon was the  
following from the Bible: "Who  
hath directed the Spirit of the Lord,  
or being his counsellor hath taught  
him? With whom took he counsel,  
and who instructed him, and taught  
him in the path of judgment, and  
taught him knowledge, and shewed  
to him the way of understanding"  
(Isaiah 40:13, 14).

The Lesson-Sermon also in-  
cluded the following passages from  
the Christian Science textbook,  
"Science and Health with Key to the  
Scriptures," by Mary Baker Eddy:  
"There can be but one Mind, because  
there is but one God; and if mortals  
claimed no other Mind and accepted  
no other, sin would be unknown. We  
can have but one Mind, if that one  
is infinite" (p. 469).
