They will gather previous to the contest for dinner and discussion of problems to be used in the meet. Teams will be striving for a grade "A" rating, which would entitle them to participate in the sectional meet on April 5th at Skokie Township High school. Further placing in the sectional event would qualify them in the regional meet in Chicago on April 19.
