Irene A. Rockenbach, town clerk of West Deerfield township, is a candidate for re-election on the Independent ticket in the election to be held Tuesday, April 1.

Miss Rockenbach is the daughter of George Rockenbach, who was elected Supervisor of West Deerfield township in 1914 and held that office for two terms. The Rockenbach family were among Lake county's earliest settlers, having come here 100 years ago from Alsace-Lorraine, France. John Jacob Ott, Miss Rockenbach's maternal great-grandfather and his family, arrived in Deerfield in 1836, taking up a tract of land in West Deerfield township on what is now called Sanders road.

In her youth Miss Rockenbach attended Deerfield schools, Lewis Institute and Boston University and specialized in business administration. Her business employment included years of secretarial work with the Postal Telegraph Company, the Chicago, Milwaukee, St. Paul and Pacific Railway and also as a teacher in leadership training at schools in Illinois and California. She is a charter member of the Deerfield Woman's club and was co-chairman of the Deerfield Centennial Celebration held in 1935.

Miss Rockenbach's platform upon which she seeks re-election includes a four year record of accomplishment—in which most accurate records of township books were kept, the economical handling of funds, and a careful budgeting and auditing of all township accounts and claims.
