

### Eleven Scout First Aid Teams Qualify For Sectional Meet

North Shore Area Council Boy Scouts, 125 in number participated in the Council First Aid Tournament last Friday evening in Libertyville High School with very satisfactory results. Thirty-five judges trained well in First Aid were present to rate fairly all teams. These judges were provided through the courtesy of the following organizations: Illinois Bell Telephone Co., Public Service Co., Libertyville Police and Fire Dept., Lake Forest Police and Fire Dept., and Lake County Sheriff's office. Eleven teams out of the twenty-five participating secured an A Rating entitling them to participate in the Sectional Meet at Nile Center High School at Skokie a week from next Saturday afternoon at 2:30 o'clock. In addition to the eleven teams from the North Shore Area Council there will be approximately twenty-five more teams from Evanston, North West Suburban, Oak Park and Oak Plain Councils. The public is cordially invited to this sectional First Aid Meet.
