Walter Pach To Speak Monday at Art League Meet

On Monday evening, April 7th, at 8:15, in its studio in Winnetka Community House, the North Shore Art League will present the internationally known painter, etcher, lecturer and writer, Walter Pach, who will speak on "Revaluations in Art" covering the changes in viewpoint regarding various works and schools. The talk will be illustrated by lantern slides.

Mr. Pach's etchings and paintings appear in the permanent collections of the Metropolitan Museum of New York, Phillips Memorial Gallery in Washington, D. C., Brooklyn Museum, Whitney Museum of American Art in New York, Cleveland Museum of Art and in many private collections. He has lectured extensively on art subjects at the Metropolitan Museum, N. Y., Ecole du Louvre, Paris; University of Mexico, Mexico City, and other places. He is known chiefly at the author of "The Masterpieces of Modern Art," "George Seurat," "Modern Art in America," "Queer Thing, Painting," "Ingres" among others, and as the translator of Elie Faure's "History of Art" and "The Journal of Eugene Delacroix." Mr. Pach is affiliated with Columbia University in New York City.

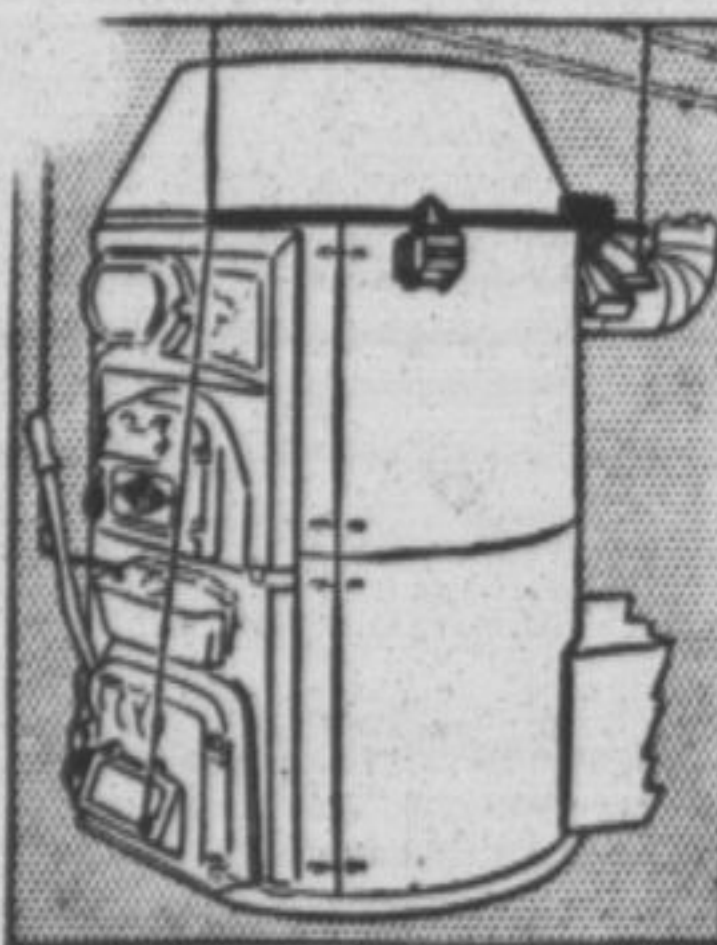
