U.S. Civil Service Exams Announced

Civil service examinations for the positions described below were announced by the United States Civil Service Commission today. Applications will be rated as received at the Commission's Washington office until further notice, but qualified persons are urged to file their applications at once. The salaries are subject to a 3-1/2 per cent retirement deduction.

Shipyards inspector, various fields, with salaries ranging from \$2,300 to \$3,800 a year, United States Maritime Commission. There are positions open for hull, machinery, electrical, joiner, and hull outfitting inspectors. Responsible practical experience in ship construction involving the type of work pertinent to the duties of the positions applied for is required. The experience must have included the interpretation of drawings and specifications and the making of such computations as are necessary to determine full compliance of work with plans and specifications. The maximum age limit is sixty-five years.

Commodity exchange specialist, with salaries ranging from \$2,600 to \$4,600 a year, Commodity Exchange Administration, Department of Agriculture. There are two options for which applicants may qualify, commodity exchange specialist in economic analysis and in investigations. Ratings in this examination will be based on applicants' education and on their appropriate professional experience. In addition, they may be asked to appear for an oral examination to further determine their fitness.

Full information as to the requirements for these examinations, and application forms, may be obtained from Frank E. Carlson, Secretary of the Board of U. S. Civil Service Examiners, at the post office or customhouse in this city, or from the Secretary of the Board of U. S. Civil Service Examiners, at any first- or second-class post office.

Fort Sheridan News

Captain and Mrs. P. F. O'Farrel and son Gene are new Fort Sheridan residents. Captain O'Farrel is the Regimental Surgeon for the 61st Coast Artillery.

Captain and Mrs. Joe Grandone and daughter Mary-Jo have gone to Carlyle Barracks, Pa., where Captain Grandone, a medical doctor, will take a months course in surgery.

Lieutenant and Mrs. Raymond Hugh Patrick Madden are on a ten day leave, visiting relatives and friends in Indiana.

Lieutenant and Mrs. Ken Volman are on six weeks leave in Colorado and California. While in Denver, Lieutenant Volman will take a refresher course at the army hospital.

Lieutenant Colonel T. B. Catron has been named to succeed Lieutenant Colonel Willis J. Tack as commanding officer of the recruit reception center. Colonel Tack has been in command since September 20, and is now retiring. He will live on his ranch in New Mexico.

This recruit station center is the only center in the United States actually in operation when the peacetime draft started.

The officers club of Fort Sheridan, along with other military posts, has discontinued the sale of hard liquors. Announcement was made by Lieutenant Colonel Fred During, post executive. It was felt that officers should not be permitted to buy liquor on the post grounds, when the enlisted men could not. Beer, however, will be sold at the officers club after four o'clock, as in the past.

Fort Sheridan authorities have given notice to lake shippers and all types of non-military aircraft to the effect that a danger zone would exist about Fort Sheridan from April 1 to June 1.

Anti-aircraft guns will be fired between the hours of 7 a. m. and 10 p. m. daily excepting Sunday. All vessels are requested to avoid the area 10 miles east, north and south of the post, or expediate passage through it. The danger zone extends up to 15,000 feet altitude.
