

**Illinois "Who's Who"
To List V. E. Carlson
In New Publication**

The 1941 edition of "Who's Who in Illinois," now being prepared for press, will list the name of Victor E. Carlson, Non-Partisan choice for President of the Deerfield Village Board. Mr. Carlson who resides at 1560 Stratford Road, moved to Deerfield five years ago.

Born in Chicago in 1898, Mr. Carlson was reared and educated in the same city. Upon leaving school he became interested in the appraisal business and entered the firm of Coats & Burchard, Public Appraisers and Engineers. He interrupted his business career to enlist in the United States Marines in 1917, an interest he maintains by membership in the Deerfield Post of the American Legion.

His occupation as a tax consultant and appraisal expert was featured by his appointment as Chief Building Appraiser in the Cook County Assessor's office in 1929, a position he held until 1932. During the suc-

ceeding years he served as a director of Harry S. Cutmore & Associates; Vice-President of the Central Appraisal Co.; Executive vice-president of the National Bureau of Property Administrators; member of the Chicago Council of Foreign Relations; the National Association of Assessing Officers; National Tax Ass'n.; Swedish Engineers Society.

He is past-president of Nordic Country Club (1937-38) and a member of the Lake Shore Athletic Club; also the Deerfield Civic Association.

Recently a special legislative committee, appointed by the Governor of Pennsylvania, invited Mr. Carlson to testify on assessment methods. His name appeared in the 1938-39 edition of "America's Young Men," the official "Who's Who" among the young men of the nation.

He married Ebba Louise Johnson in 1922 and they have two children—Lois Ann, born Nov. 1, 1925 and Victor Jr., born in 1927. Both children attend Deerfield schools.

Recently Mr. Carlson was selected by a citizens' caucus, to run for the office of Village President in Deer-

field. In accepting, Mr. Carlson stated: "I did not seek this office, but if the people of this village think I should run and should choose to elect me, I make only one promise,—I will do my best not to disappoint them."
