## Arthur Baker Elected Township Supervisor Of West Deerfield

Arthur Baker was elected supervisor of West Deerfield Township on Tuesday with a vote of 658. His opponents were Woodman W. Todd with a vote of 372; Ross R. Sherman, incumbent, 222; and Peter J. Duffy, 123 votes. The Township was voted dry by a vote of 793 to 573. Justices of the Peace who were elected were Eldon Frost, Fred Meyer and Arthur Pearson. Constables elected were Percy McLaughlin, Phil Scully and Joseph McCraren. Miss Irene A. Rockenbach was reelected town clerk and E. H. Selig, reelected assessor, each with overwhelming majorities. Raymond Clavey was elected town collector and Richard W. Farmer and Fred J. LaBah, library directors.
