Three Parties Seek Election in Highwood

**Hotly Contested Battle
Expected Tuesday, April 15.
Policies Told**

Highwood's city election, which will be held Tuesday, April 15th will be a hotly contested battle between three major parties, namely the Capable Party, Ideal Party and Improvement Party.

Mayor Charles Portilia, present incumbent, heads the improvement party, and is seeking re-election for a second term, on the merits of his accomplishments during the past two years of service to his community. Installation of a water plant, and several other improvement projects are included in his achievements. Other members of his party seeking election are: John Ugolini, City Clerk; Edgar C. Benson, city treasurer; John Lenzini, Police Magistrate; Henry Carlsen, Alderman first ward; George C. Kenry, Alderman second ward; John Castellari, Alderman third ward; and Geno Fiocchi, Alderman fourth ward.

The Ideal Party, which is headed by Albert Bork, stands for Qualified men in office; Operating city affairs within the city's income; All types of local improvements desired by the people; Efficient and courteous police force; the right of Highwood citizens to a referendum vote on Mayor Questions of City Policy. Those seeking office on the Ideal party are: Mayor, Albert Bork; City Clerk, O. Thomas Saielli; City Treasurer, Fred Ehrens; Police Magistrate, Nello Ori; Alderman first ward, Oscar Ahlberg; Alderman second ward, Roy Olson; third ward, Joseph Calzia; Alderman fourth ward, Roy Russell. Bork is at present serving as an alderman as is Calzia.

T. E. Russel is seeking the office of Mayor heading the Capable Party of Highwood. Their platform consists of Harmony in City Council, Equality for all; efficient, honest government, full cooperation with business and civic groups, qualified police department and honest and intelligent administration of offices. Those seeking office with Mr. Russel are, Louis Bernardoni, city clerk; Fred Lund, city treasurer; Joseph Ariano, police magistrate; Edward Olson, alderman first ward; John Shelton, alderman second ward; Ricco Ladurini, alderman third ward, and Nello Fabbri, alderman fourth ward.
