The Harry D. Pertz family, 704 Ridgewood drive, are vacationing in New Orleans, La.

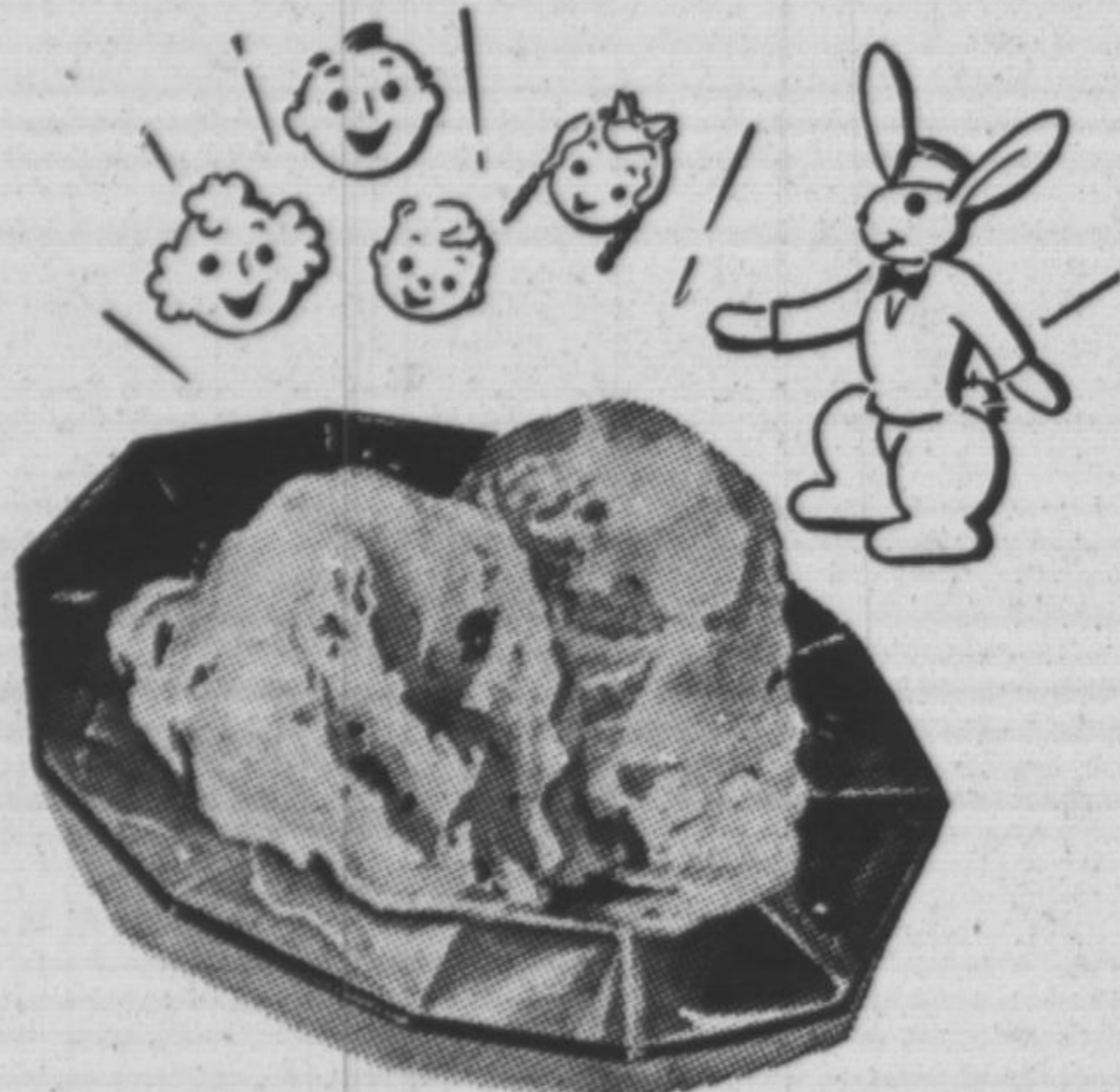
