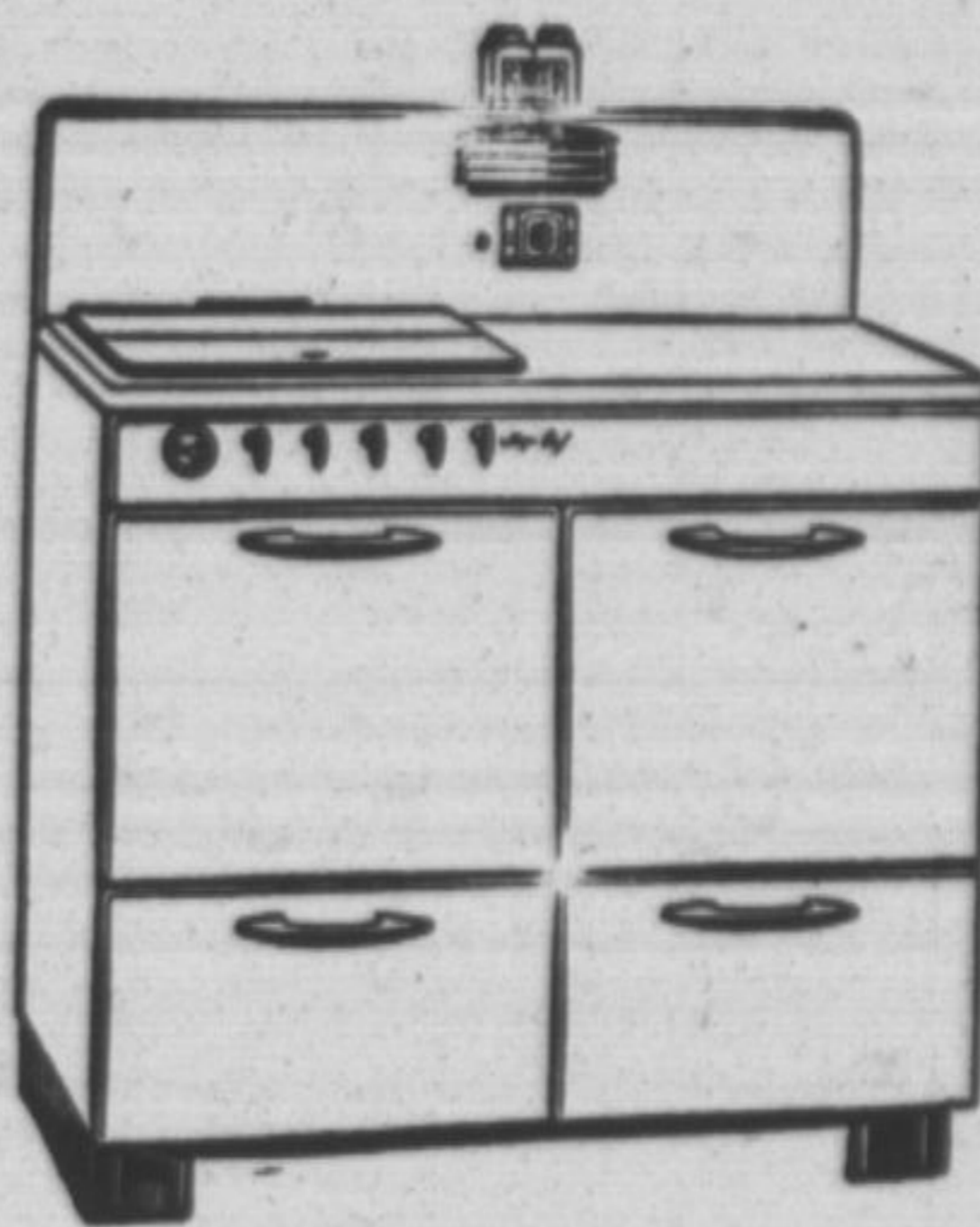
#### Fine Delinquents
