Plan Garden Depot For R.R. Station

The Highland Park railroad sta-
tion is undergoing a face-lifting op-
eration. The beautification project
is now going on, and toward the
end of spring, great improvement
should be in evidence. C. Eugene
Pfister, chairman of the committee
in charge, says that the improve-
ment project will begin with the
Central avenue depot in Highland
Park and as soon as it is possible
it will extend to depot both north
and south of that point. The pro-
gram includes the planting of trees
and shrubs. Citizens will be called
upon for financial assistance in the
purchase of these trees and shrubs,
and the maintenance of the depot
garden will be taken care of by the
Park Board.

Marshall Johnson, architect, is
working on the plans, which were
worked basically around the traffic
control. The plan is worked out
that it may be extended over sev-
eral planting seasons if necessary.
