## Ballet Russe Opens In Spring Program

With its 65 famous dancers, accompanied by a full symphony orchestra, and with all the glamour and excitement that comprises Russian ballet at its greatest, the Ballet Russe de Monte Carlo, Leonide Massine, artistic director, will return to the Auditorium theatre for a gala engagement opening Monday night, April 28 and continuing thru May 10. The engagement, which will bring this great dance organization to Chicago at popular prices for the first time, was announced this week by Allied Arts corporation which sponsors this great spring festival of ballet.

A major change in the personnel has been affected since the company visited here for their annual Christmas engagement this year, for Tamara Toumanova, one of the great ballerinas of all time, is now with the company. In addition to Mademoiselle Toumanova, a number of Chicago's favorite ballet artists will return with the company. They include Leonide Massine, Alexandra Danilova, Mia Slavenska, Nathalie Krassovska, Igor Youskevitch, Andre Aglevsky, Frederic Franklin and George Zoritch.

The ballets to be presented include several which have not been seen here during the past few seasons. "Three Cornered Hat," the brilliant Massine - DeFalla - Picasso collaboration; "Carnaval," music by Schumann, choreography by Fokine and setting by Bakst; "Le Beau Danube," Massine choreography, Strauss music, and Beaumont decor; and "Prince Igor" are among these.
