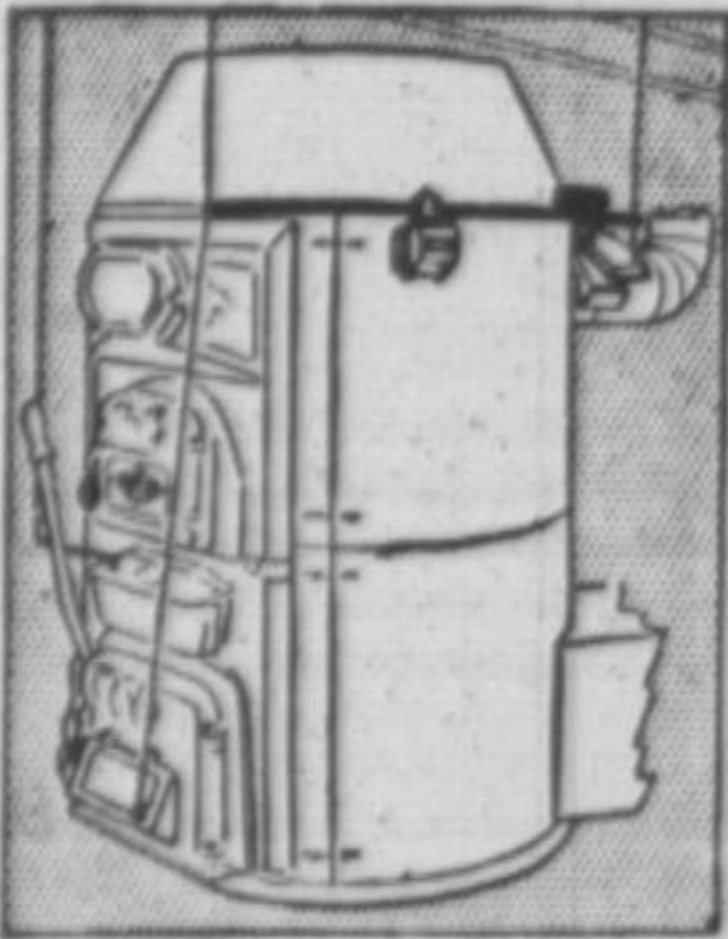
### DANCE PUPILS PRESENT PROGRAM
