

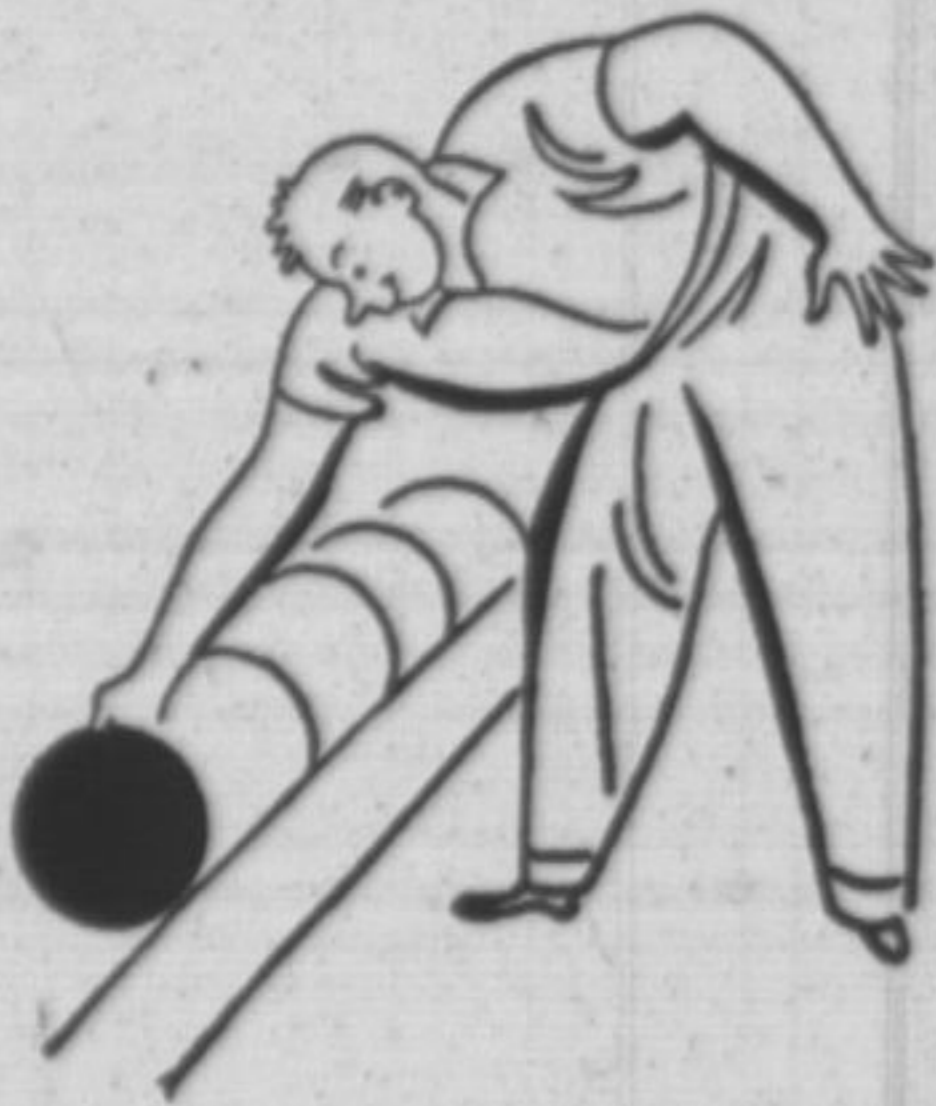
F. Abe Cronkhite Dies In Chicago Home
