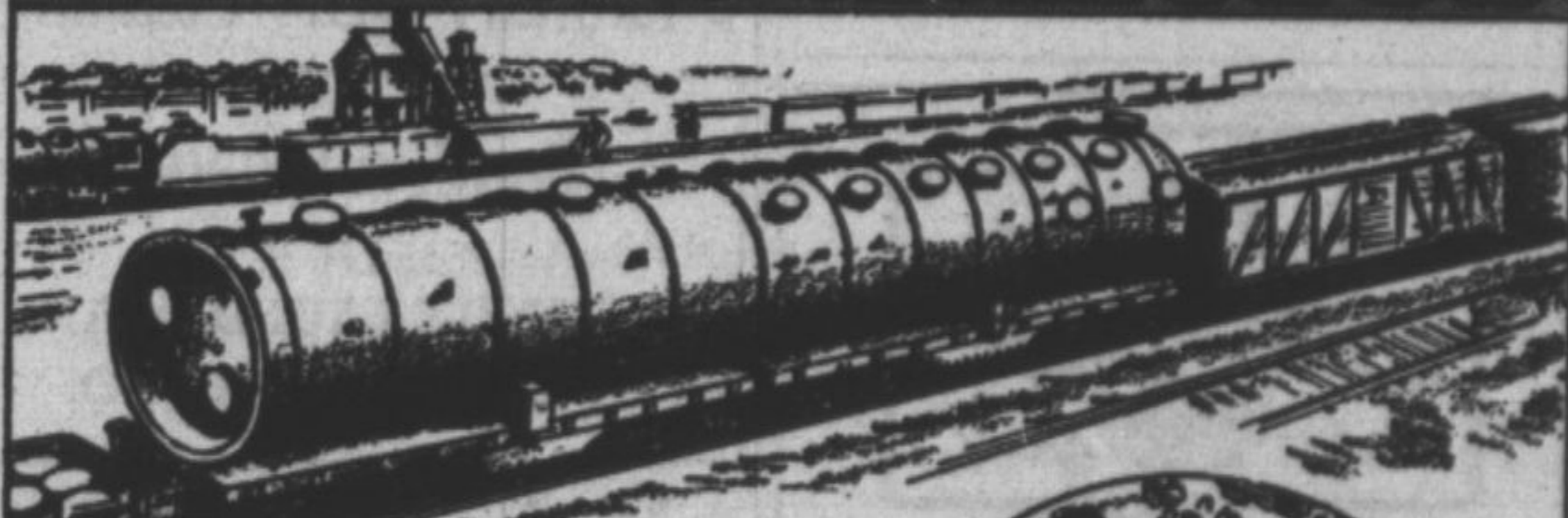

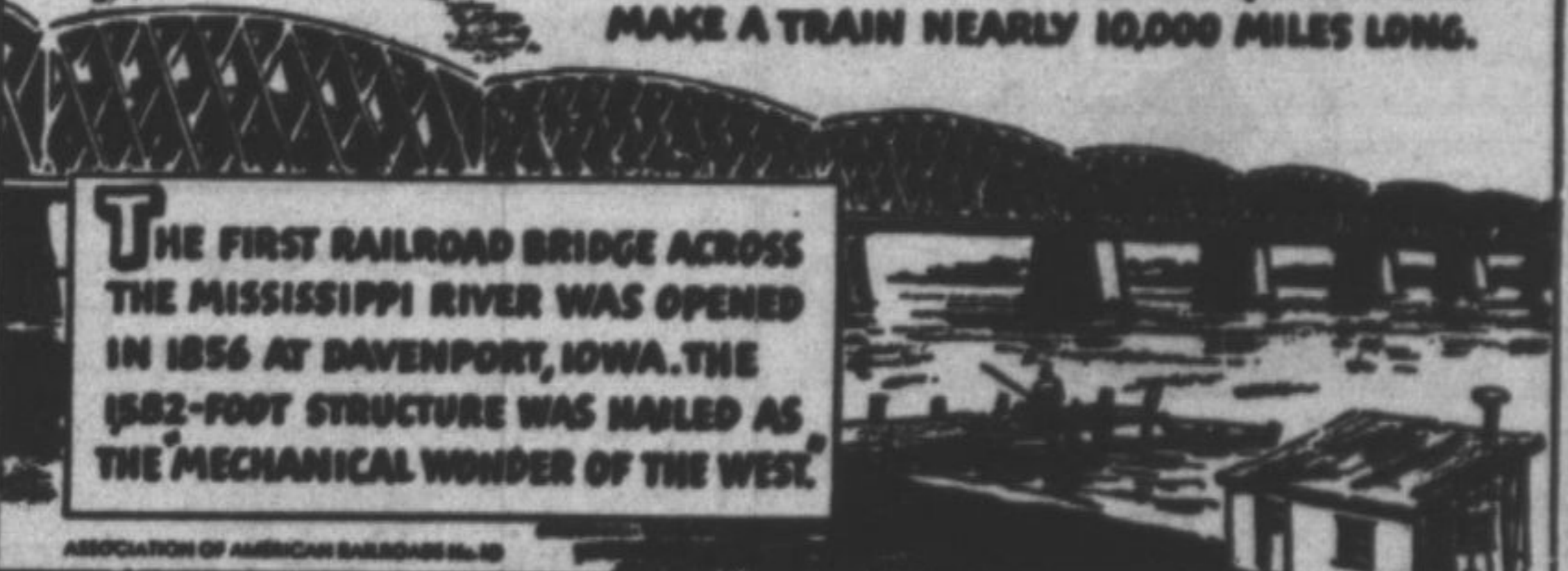
## Rail oddities



TO AN OIL REFINERY FRACTIONATING COLUMN, OR "BUBBLE" TOWER, GOES THE HONOR OF BEING THE HEAVIEST PIECE OF FREIGHT EVER MOVED BY THE RAILROADS. IT WEIGHED 488,200 POUNDS AND WAS SHIPPED IN 1938.



SINCE 1929, THE RAILROADS HAVE PUT IN SERVICE 1,467,000 NEW FREIGHT CARS AND 17,000 NEW LOCOMOTIVES. COUPLED TOGETHER, THEY WOULD MAKE A TRAIN NEARLY 10,000 MILES LONG.



THE FIRST RAILROAD BRIDGE ACROSS THE MISSISSIPPI RIVER WAS OPENED IN 1856 AT DAVENPORT, IOWA. THE 1582-FOOT STRUCTURE WAS NAILED AS THE MECHANICAL WONDER OF THE WEST.
