Rene Leroy, French Flutist At Ravinia

Will Appear as Soloist Saturday with Sir Thomas Beecham

Beecham, British Thomas batoneer, is now in his second week 3. of conducting the Chicago Symphony orchestra at Ravinia Park.

Soloist with the orchestra for Saturday, July 12, is Rene Leroy, French flutist, who will play Mozart's Concerto in D Major for Flute and Orchestra.

Leroy has appeared many times 1. Overture to "Russlan and Ludmilla" with major symphony orchestras 2. abroad. A student of the flute since he was eight years old, he was director of the French Wind-Instrument society while still an undergraduate at the Paris Conservatoire.

The war abroad is responsible for Leroy's coming to America. He escaped from Paris during the German conquest, but his car was hit by a bomb and hurled into a ravine. Unhurt, Leroy was picked up by a 3. truck of the British RAF and taken to Orleans. After a week of hard- 5. ship, during which time he suffered from hunger and exposure, he reached unoccupied France. All his possessions were gone except his flute.

Following Sir Thomas Beecham on the Ravinia podium is Nicolai Malko, Russian-born conductor, whose first appearance at the Park last season was a great success. He will conduct the Chicago Symphony Orchestra for a week, starting July

Gitta Gradova, Chicago, pianist, will be soloist under Malko's baton on Thursday, July 17. She will play the Rachmaninoff Rhapsody on a Theme of Paganini. Born in Chicago of Russian parentage, Miss Gradova started playing the piano when she was three. In 1923 she made her official debut in New York, and since then has toured the United States and Europe, appearing as soloist with several major symphony orchestras. This is her second appearance at Ravinia, her first occuring in 1938.
