It's a girl at the Albert Kurtzons, 3337 Woodland road. The baby was born at the Highland Park hospital, July 28.

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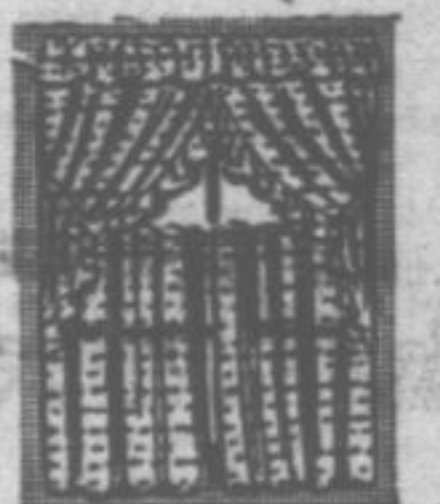


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
