



Chicago Squadron To Select Own Insignia

Within a day or two after Chicago's Own Squadron goes into training at the United States naval aviation base at Glenview, Ill. Sept. 30, it will select an insignia for its organization designed by one of several hunrded public school pupils and art students in the Chicago area.

This was assured today when Lieut. Carl G. Olson of the Naval Flight Selection board announced that of the several hundred insignias submitted in the Chicagoland contest sponsored by the Warren V. Woody committee of former World war naval aviators, the judges have chosen five entries from which the members of Chicago's Own Squad-
