Hotels Receiving More Permanent Guests Daily

Marked gains in room occupancy as compared to a year ago and other upward trends were reported yesterday (Wed.) by Richard D. Culver, head of the hotel division of Baird and Warner for the five hotels under their management.

"Increases are noted in the number of transient and permanent guests as well," said Mr. Culver. "The home-building situation and shortage of domestic help are factors which explain some of the gains in the number of permanent guests in our hotels. The volume of transient guest business is especially interesting as an indication of a generally increased hotel activity in Chicago, an upward movement which is making itself felt not only in the loop but in outlying hotels as well."

The Baird and Warner hotel division at the present time has the management of the Flamingo On-the-Lake Hotel, the Hyde Park Hotel, the Sherwin On-the-Lake Hotel, the Sovereign Hotel, Chicago, and Hotel Moraine On-the-Lake in Highland Park, with a combined capacity of approximately 1800 rooms.

The present occupancy situation at the Moraine which is now operated on a year-around basis cannot be compared with that of last year as the hotel was closed for several years when it was operated as a summer resort only. The volume of rentals, and bookings for meetings, conventions and other events at the Moraine give a further index of improved hotel business this year, Mr. Culver pointed out.

A program providing for group advertising and other promotion of the five Baird and Warner hotels is being worked out through brokers and other agencies, Mr. Culver said.
