Congressman George A. Paddock of the 10th District reports that pressure of defense administration in Washington has delayed the handling of correspondence, claims, and other action not only in OPM, OPA, and the War and Navy Departments, but also in the Civil Service Commission.

Available through the congressman's office are the War Department regulations for discharge from the Army on grounds of hardship.

Passed by the Senate November 10, Congressman Paddock's bill to convey to the City of Evanston the historic Grosse Pointe lighthouse needs only presidential signature before becoming law.
