### **Bali And Java Dancers At** Civic Opera

Devi Dja and her Bali and Java Dancers will present a single performance at the Civic Theatre, Sunday afternoon, April 12, for the benefit of the Queen Wilhelmina Fund, Inc. Proceeds, from the performance will be used to relieve the sufferings of the inhabitants of the Dutch East Indies, which were conquered by the Japs last month.

All members of the troupe are natives of Bali, Java, Sumatra, or of other islands in the Dutch East Indies. They portray in their exquisite dancing the age-old culture of the Javanese and the Balinese. From earliest life these island people express their emotions, customs, and national life in dance, and it is this sensitivity to mood which is so beautifully captured by Devi Dja and her dancers.

The troupe's repertoire runs the gamut from fierce rituals of war to languorous love dances, reflecting the varying degrees of civilization which prevail in the Dutch East Indies. Each movement of each dance has a 'special significance, expressing as it does a change of mood or feeling.
