Commander Brahtz, a navy veteran, was stationed at Pearl Harbor at the time of the Japanese attack. Frank Wichman entertained his fellow Rotarians with an illustrated talk on the building of the Panama canal at the meeting last Monday.

Don't Make Unnecessary Calls To Washington

"In a further effort to keep long distance telephone lines available for calls directly affecting the successful prosecution of the war, the Illinois Bell Telephone Company is undertaking an intensive advertising campaign to that end."

Mr. Knox stated that there are very definite things which the public can do to ease the burden on long distance telephone lines. He listed these in their order of importance as follows:

1. Do not call anyone in Washington, D. C., unless your call is most urgent.

2. Whenever possible, make your long distance calls after 9 p.m. or on Sundays.

3. Plan what you want to say so that your call will be brief and a second call unnecessary.

Mr. Knox said that, in normal times, new long distance lines could be constructed to relieve congestion, but that the scarcity of copper, rubber and other materials needed for armaments makes such construction impossible in wartime.
