Ann Arenberg Has Part In Production At Colorado Camp

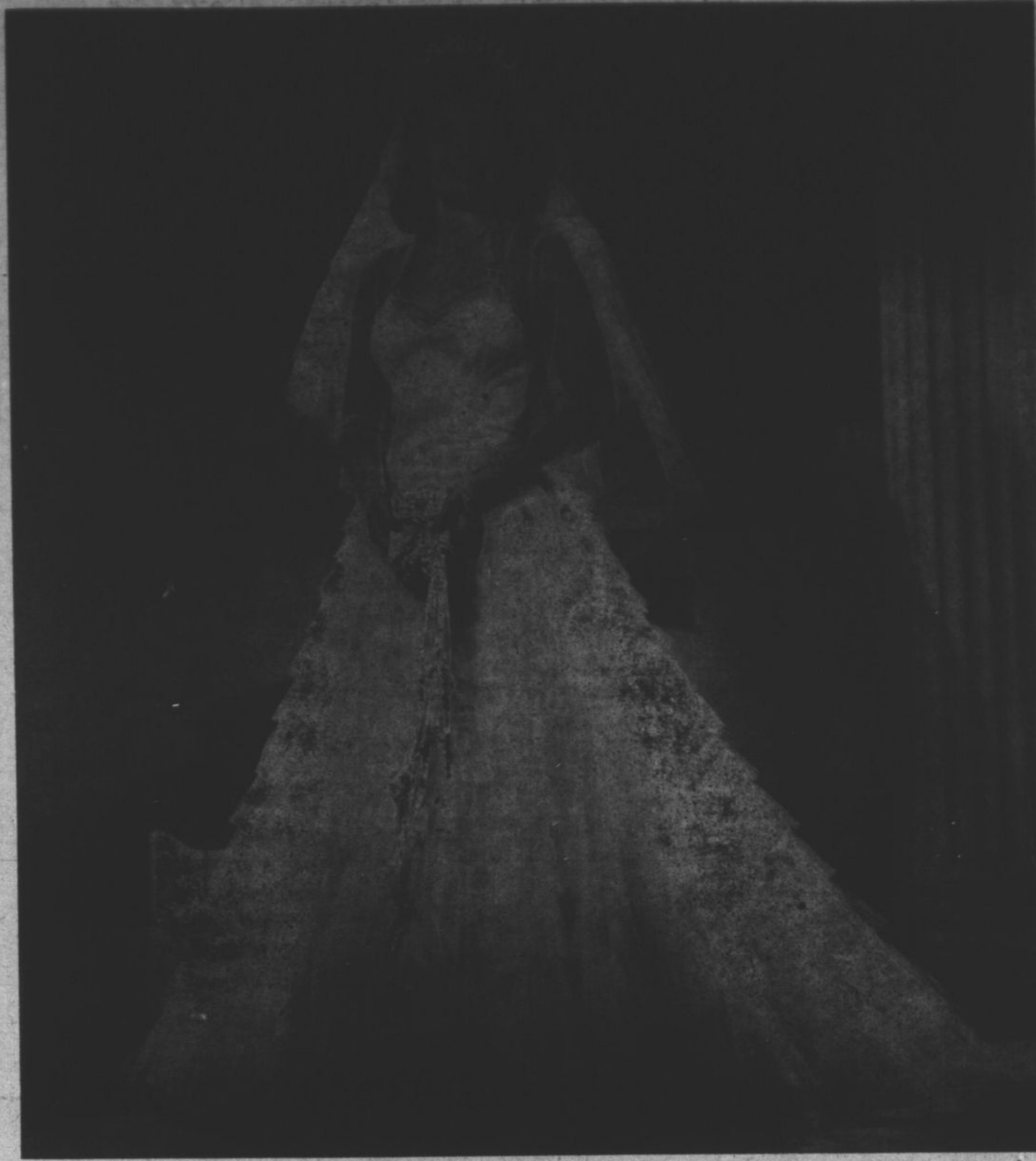

Mrs. Bowden Has Tea for Rodzinskys and Polish Officials

Mrs. Arthur Rodzinsky, and members and officials of the Polish Arts Club of Chicago, were guests for tea at the home of Mrs. George K. Bowden, on Saturday, while Mr. Rodzinsky was rehearsing the orchestra for the evening concert. Mrs. Rodzinsky is organizing a similar organization in Cleveland, and is also active in promoting interest in the Paderewski Memorial Hospital in Edinburgh, Scotland. Funds for the hospital are collected through the Paderewski foundation of which Mrs. Vernon Kellogg of N. Y. is president.

Following the Sunday afternoon concert in Ravinia, the Polish Arts Club held an informal reception in the pavilion for Mr. and Mrs. Rodzinsky. At their urgent request, no refreshments were served, since Mrs. Rodzinsky felt that all such expenditures should be done away with in favor of the needs of Polish Relief. She states that the only remnant of the Polish medical profession is now in the Paderewski Memorial Hospital in Scotland, supported wholly by voluntary donations. There they are not only helping in the present emergency, but training Polish doctors and continuing experimentation, so that the moment Poland is free, the hospital and its equipment will be moved to Polish soil, with a nucleus of a new medical profession. Right now, Mrs. Rodzinsky says, the crying need is, not only for ambulances, but for more X-Ray equipment for combating tuberculosis.
