
CHRISTIAN SCIENCE CHURCHES

Materials Plan Creates Need For Specialists

Today the United States Civil Serice commission began a nation-wide earch for the production specialists who will administer War Production board's new Controlled Materials

The Controlled Materials plan, deigned to balance essential industrial production against available stockiles of critical materials, will go into

peration in 1943. "Many hundreds of production and naterials control specialists must be recruited," the commission states, "for one of the biggest of home front jobs. All available men whose experience demonstrates their ability to coordinate and schedule industrial production in certain fields are being called upon to make their services available wherever possible."

Urgently sought right now are persons with industrial or engineering experience in the fields of copper, aluminum, carbon steel, and alloy steel. Also highly important to this program are those with such experience in (1) machine tool and machinery production; (2) electrical and communications equipment; (3) transportation equipment, such as aircraft, ships and railroad motive power, and rolling stock; (4) engineering materials such as plastics, rubber, and construction materials.

Appointed to Agencies

Under the plan, these persons will Assuming that each patron will be appointed to WPB, war, navy and complete a book to the value of \$25,000 other war agencies to assist in the bond, Uncle Sam will sell \$750,000.00 allotment of critical materials going into military and essential civilian supplies and equipment.

Head specialists will receive \$6,500 a vear; others \$4,600 and \$5,600 a year. Many positions, however, must be filled at salaries ranging from \$2,000 to \$3,800 a year. Jobs are located in Washington, D. C., and throughout the nation.

Persons interested may obtain the commission's announcement 279 concerning the jobs from local representatives at first and second-class post offices, or from the U. S. Civil Service commission, Washington, D. C. No written test will be given, and there is no maximum age limit.

18 New U.S.O. Clubs Open **During Week**

Eighteen new U.S.O. clubs and service units were opened last week, bringing the total U.S.O. operations to 1,115, it has been announced by J. R. Short, president of the U.S.O. Chicago area.

A total of 614 U.S.O. clubhouses, situated in 473 cities and towns in 47 states, now offer well-rounded recreational and social programs to service men during their off-duty hours from army camps and navy posts. In addition, 57 U.S.O. clubs provide typical U.S.O. activities to men stationed in 6 hemisphere bases, including Hawaii, Alaska, Newfoundland, Panama Canal Zone, and other areas in the Caribbean Sea.

Also in the continental United States, there are 205 smaller service centers, other than clubs, which put on dances and organize special programs for soldiers and sailors. Traveling men in uniform find comfortable lounges, reading and writing material and informatioin service in 87 railroad and bus terminals at the principal transportation centers of the nation. The U.S.O. Mobile service brings "USO clubs on wheels" to soldiers, sailors and coastguardsmen stationed in sections remote from usual recreational facilities.

More than 3,250,000 service men now visit U.S.O. clubs and service centers each month. Total attendance. including civilians and return trips of the men themselves is over 9.000-000 a month.
