Civil Service Exam Announced For Dietitian

A United States Civil Service examination to fill student dietitian positions in the Army Medical center, Washington, D. C., will be held at Waukegan, Frank Carlson, Local Secretary for the U. S. Civil Service commission, announced today.

Women with appropriate college courses in dietetics are eligible to apply. Applications must reach the commission's Washington office on or before January 9, 1943.

"Student dietitians," Mr. Carlson reported, "receive subsistence, quarters, and a small remuneration during their 6 months training at the Army Medical center. They are then raised to apprentice dietitians at \$1,440 a year, and 6 months later, may be promoted to staff dietitians a \$1,800 a year."

Full information as to requirements and application blanks may be obtained from Frank E. Carlson at the Highland Park post office or from the U. S. Civil Service commission in Washington, D. C.

Applications are not desired from persons already engaged in war work unless they will employ higher skills as student dietitians. War manpower restrictions on federal appointments are given in Form 3989, posted in first- and second-class post offices.

Make Survey Of Manpower Needed To Harvest Crops

Determined to reach next year's production goals in the Illinois "Food for Victory" program, the United States Employment service of the War Manpower commission is making an intensive survey that will show by counties the manpower needed to harvest crops.

Working in conjunction with leading Illinois farm organizations, the War Manpower agency anticipates completion of the survey by January 30, 1943. Information resulting from the survey will include the dates when crops will be harvested, the price paid per unit and the manpower needed during seasonal periods.

"Volunteer farm placement representatives are being recruited by the Employment Service to work in communities throughout the State," said Harold C. Buchanan, Farm Placement Supervisor for the Employment Service in Illinois.

"These representatives will assist 70 full-time men already established in key agricultural communities. Supplying the food needed for both military and civilian use is too big a job to leave to chance," he declared.

Wartime Meat Supply and Electric Power in Northern Illinois

Meat is fighting food. That's why millions of pounds must be produced each day to feed our men in armed forces and to meet the increasing need of our allies.

In answering the tremendous wartime demand for meat, the production methods developed through years of peacetime progress are proving highly efficient. Electric devices, for example, grind the feed, pump the water, and perform dozens of chores on the livestock farms of Northern Illinois.

And in the great packing houses, electric saws speed the eviscerating of meat... electric conveyors keep it moving quickly, and huge electric refrigerators preserve its purity and freshness until the moment of shipment.

Our employees realize that maintaining the flow of electricity for this purpose is as vital as providing power for the production of guns, tanks and ships.

Electric saws, like other modern electric equipment, are important factors in the speed and efficiency with which the packing houses are supplying meat for our armed forces.

After bacon has been sliced into uniform strips by an automatic electric slicing machine, an electric conveyor carries the bacon to workers who weigh and pack it for shipment.
