Ensign Shaffer attended navy schools in Boston and Norfolk, Virginia. Upon graduation from the latter in August, he was ordered to sea duty. ### Col. M. T. Tschou to Address N. S. Sunday Evening Club Jan. 10

Col. M. Thomas Tschou, former secretary to General Chiang Kai-shek, Generalissimo of the Chinese army, will be the speaker at the North Shore Sunday evening club at New Trier high school on Sunday, January 10. He will speak on "China's Role in the New World Order."

Col. Tschou was for three years director of the labor department of the Chinese government and China's chief representative at the International Labor conference at Geneva where he was elected vice-president. He is regarded as a leading authority on all Asiatic and European affairs as well as being one of China's leading social thinkers.

Col. Tschou is a direct descendant of the great Chinese philosopher and Confucian scholar, Chu Hsi, Song Dynasty—12th Century. Col. Tschou was the master of Chinese classics at the age of 12. He spent nine years in Europe as a student receiving his degree from the University of Glasgow, Scotland, in mechanical, civil and naval engineering. He is the author of many publications dealing with housing, social and labor problems in China. He also ranks as one of China's foremost painters and is an accomplished linguist, speaking English, French and German as well as Chinese.
