"Man" was the subject of the Lesson-Sermon in all Churches of Christ, Scientist, on Sunday, March 7th.

The Golden Text was, "As many as are led by the Spirit of God, they are the sons of God" (Romans 8: 14).

He is the compound idea of God, including all right ideas; the generic term for all that reflects God's image and likeness; the conscious identity of being as found in Science, in which man is the reflection of God, or Mind, and no separate mind from God; that which has not a single quality undervived from Deity; that which possesses no life, intelligence, nor creative power of his own, but reflects spiritually all that belongs to his Maker" (p. 475).
