COW OF DEERFIELD MAN SETS RECORD

A registered Holstein-Friesian cow in the dairy herd owned by R. V. Rasmussen, Deerfield, has recently completed a 365-day production record of 794 pounds of butterfat and 21,805 pounds of milk. The Holstein-Friesian Association of America announces. This is nearly 4 1/2 times the production of the average dairy cow in the nation.

Her official name is Alexina Bessie Ruth. She was milked 3 times daily and was 6 years of age when she began her test period. Testing was supervised by the University of Illinois in cooperation with The Holstein-Friesian Association of America.
