Among the citations which comprised the Lesson-Sermon was the following from the Bible: "Wash you, make you clean; put away the evil of your doings from before mine eyes; cease to do evil; Learn to do well; Come now, and let us reason together, saith the Lord: though your sins be as scarlet, they shall be as white as snow; though they be red like crimson, they shall be as wool. If ye be willing and obedient, ye shall eat the good of the land", (Isaiah I: 16, 18, 19).

The Lesson-Sermon also included the following passages from the Christian Science textbook, "Science and Health with Key to the Scriptures," by Mary Baker Eddy: "A sinner can receive no encouragement from the fact that Science demonstrates the unreality of evil for the sinner would make a reality of sin,-would make that real which is unreal, and thus heap up 'wrath against the day of wrath.'
