## First Performance of Zion Passion Play Easter Sunday

Carrying out one of the last wishes of Wilbur Glen Voliva before his death last Fall, the Zion Passion Play will be produced as usual this year from Easter Sunday April 25, every Sunday thru May and June. In the opinion of Voliva, world famous for many years as Overseer of the Christian Catholic Church of Zion, the 300 townspeople who take part in the play derive an immeasurable benefit from living within their characterizations of love and goodness during their six months of rehearsals.

It was at the direction of Voliva that young Jabez Taylor visited the Holy Land in 1935 to prepare a sacred program for the Easter services of his church. While there he took many pictures and made notes on the places mentioned in the Bible. From these he later designed sets for the play as it is given today.

Embracing the ministry, passion, resurrection, and ascension of Jesus of Nazareth, the 27 scenes of the three hour production are based entirely on the account found in the four Gospels of Matthew, Mark, Luke and John. The words of the Christus do not deviate in a single instance from biblical quotations.

Twelve thousand persons witnessed the play last year but even more are expected this year since the play affords a three hour relief from thoughts of war and the world of today.

## Invite Ministers To Attend Voters League Meeting

Invitations to be the guests of the Highland Park League of Women Voters at the League's luncheon meeting to be held on Wednesday, April 28, at the Moraine hotel, have been extended to the ministers of the city's seven churches by the organization's president, Mrs. Louis P. Haller.

The leaders of four Protestant churches, two Catholic churches, and the Christian Science church have all been included in Mrs. Haller's invitation to luncheon at the Moraine, and to hear the afternoon's speaker, William D. Clark, who will deal with the subject "Economic Problems Now and After the War." Mr. Clark, a graduate of Oxford university in England and former instructor at the University of Chicago, is assistant director of the Chicago office of the British Information Service.

## Special Choirs to Sing At Methodist Church On Easter

Ten o'clock will be the hour for the combined church school and morning worship service at the Highland Park Methodist church on Easter Sunday.

Two separate choirs will add their anthems to the beginning of the program, in which the children's classes of the church school also will take part. For the remainder of the service, the young people will retire to the church basement for their own Easter observance.

The choir will sing Helen Dickinson's "By Early Morning Light," arranged by Reiman-Dickinson. The responsive reading of Stanley Dickinson's anthem, "Thanks Be To God," will be offered by a special choir of adults.

Rev. Charles W. Seward, the pastor, will present the Easter message under the title "Living Christ's Life." The regular choir will conclude the service with Peter C. Lutkin's "The Lord Bless Thee and Keep Thee."

On Good Friday evening at 8 o'clock there will be the Service of the Cross, which consists of hymns, psalter, prayers and the meditations on the seven words from the Cross, at Trinity Episcopal church.

On Sunday—Easter Even—at 4:00 o'clock, the Office of Holy Baptism will be read.

On Easter day there will be a celebration of the Holy communion at 7:30 a. m., with organ music; at 11 o'clock the boys' and men's choir will sing a choral Holy Communion and the rector will preach; and at 4 p. m. the church school will have its Easter service and present at the Altar their Lenten offering boxes.

The Reverend Christoph Keller is rector of Trinity church, Paul Mallory the choirmaster and Miss Caroline Fosberg the organist.

## Laura Stoddard, Local School Teacher, Dies

Petter, medical director of the Lake County Tuberculosis sanatorium, who is also a member of the executive committee of the association, has invited the association to meet at the sanatorium, Wednesday, April 28, at 7 p.m. From 7 to 8 p.m., there will be conducted tours of the sanatorium.

The annual business meeting of the association will convene at 8 p.m. The usual election of board members will be held. Harry A. Hall, treasurer, will give the financial statement for the fiscal period ending March 31, 1943, and the final report from the Christmas seal sale. Miss White will touch on the highlights of the activities of the association for the last sixteen months. Dr. Petter will give a resume of the work of the sanatorium.

## CHRISTIAN SCIENCE CHURCHES

"Doctrine of Atonement" was the subject of the Lesson-Sermon in all Churches of Christ, Scientist, on Sunday, April 18.

The Golden Text was, "Grace be to you and peace from God the Father, and from our Lord Jesus Christ, who gave himself for our sins, that he might deliver us from this present evil world, according to the will of God and our Father (Galatians 1: 3, 4)."

Among the citations which comprised the Lesson-Sermon was the following from the Bible: "Sacrifice and offering thou didst not desire; mine ears hast thou opened; burnt offering and sin offering hast thou not required. I delight to do thy will, O my God; yes, thy law is within my heart" (Psalms 40: 6, 8).

The Lesson-Sermon also included the following passages from the Christian Science textbook, "Science and Health with Key to the Scriptures," by Mary Baker Eddy: "Atonement is the exemplification of man's unity with God, whereby man reflects divine Truth, Life, and Love. The atonement of Christ reconciles man to God, not God to man; for the divine Principle of Christ is God, and how can God propitiate Himself? Even Christ cannot reconcile Truth to error, for Truth and error are irreconcilable" (P. 18, 19).
