

# In The Nations Service

In a letter to Dr. H. B. Roberts, Sergeant Alex McPherson, who is at present stationed in Atlanta, Ga., has a few remarks about army life to make:

Dear Doctor:  
Thanks for the promotion to "colonel" in your last address even though a "blue grass" one, but I'll settle for the recent promotion to sergeant.

Since last time I wrote, I have experienced nine weeks of technical (surgical) school training at Denver, Colorado, and five weeks more overseas preparation here in the heart of "Jaw-jah."

Had my first experience at drilling the platoon in this man's army yesterday. Made the boys do six "to the rear marches" in about five seconds and then had them count cadence until they were blue in the face. Wonder why they call me Sgt. Legree!

In my estimation the majority of these Southern belles are inferior in

looks to the Yankee gals. Liked Denver better than Atlanta as a city. Food, climate, discipline, location etc., here are A-1 for I-A's.

The Colonel asked me how tall I was in inspection today. Three other fellows got K.P. for not knowing answers to other questions. At times, height has its advantages. Everyone around here looks up to me.

Our entire company cooled off in the Atlanta Y.M.C.A. swimming pool the other day.

Am now a member of the 4th Auxiliary Surgical group. We consist of 132 doctors, 70 nurses, 52 sergeants, and 79 corporals. The remaining 40 or so are Pfc's or privates. Hope to become a member of an operating team. Army life is now heaven compared to that basic training at Camp Grant.

My, that T-bone steak I had this noon was delicious! This must be torturing to you point-eating civilians. A blackout is about to occur so that is a good excuse to back out of this letter. I remain a fellow medical man and friend," Alex"

Previously, there was no fixed educational requirements and the minimum score in the mental alertness test was 50.
